Free Family Day Out at the History Centre, Chippenham

The History Centre is holding its first ever Food Festival on 14 April celebrating Wiltshire's food heritage with a day of **free activities, talks and displays**.

The Women's Institute will also be on hand with a pop-up café, selling tea, coffee and heritage cakes throughout the day. Activities include:

- Hands-on sessions for children with local historian Lucy Whitfield. They will recreate medieval gingerbread and a Roman olive relish.
- Talks from author Sally McPherson and chef Deborah Loader on the history of food and from local cheese-maker Ceri Cryer who will be talking about the traditional Wiltshire Loaf cheese she makes using her great grandfather's recipe.
- Historians from English Heritage will be on hand with a display on food and feasting at Stonehenge.
- Also on display will be some of the fascinating archives housed at the History Centre detailing sumptuous feasts enjoyed by the wealthy people and the diet of gruel endured by workhouse inmates.
