## Term 3—9th January 2020

Welcome Back and a Very Happy New Year to you all!

The first week of term is always an exciting time with new topics and units of learning being launched. Visiting classes this week has been an absolute pleasure — the children being completely engaged in their learning and not even noticing when I have popped in! With this week's Newsletter, class letters and curriculum maps will also be sent home giving a flavour of the topics your child will be exploring during the Spring Term.

I echo a plea from class teachers regarding reading at home with an adult and supporting Home Learning activities. These times are such beneficial opportunities for your child, reinforcing skills learnt at school and developing fluency and understanding in the texts that are being read. If children are fluent and confident in literacy and numeracy skills they will be better equipped in applying and building on these skills in all areas of their learning.

As I mentioned before the Christmas break our school's performance data was published in early December. Stanton were placed 9th in all of the 243 primary schools in Wiltshire. We firmly believe that our approach to being confident in those basic skills from Reception through to Year 6 allows our children to be confident learners and achieve the very best outcomes they possibly can do. For this to happen there must be partnership between home and school. We do this by sharing what we are learning about; inviting you into school to come and join in with our learning; holding formal and informal meetings about your child's learning; and asking you to support and be involved in the Home Learning tasks that are set.

This term our learning will incorporate a 'Healthy Me' Week. This will take place between 20th–24th January. During this week we will be exploring healthy minds and bodies and look at ways in which we are able to adopt and make healthy choices. During the week the school nurse will be visiting to look at the importance of hydration with the children; Mrs Knight will be leading on fitness sessions and Abbeyfield School Sports Ambassadors will be running a multi-skills session with Darling Class. On the Thursday morning of that week, the whole school will visit Stanton Woods for Woods Learning. So children will need to come 'booted and suited' with lots of warm layers, bringing their school uniform to get changed into afterwards. To finish our week The Farm Cookery School will be running workshops and a Food Fayre exploring, making and tasting healthy snacks. This has been very kindly funded by FOSS. There has been much planning done in the background and we are very much looking forward to the week now. We would love for you to join us for the Food Fayre on the Friday afternoon—the timings are being finalised and will be confirmed in next weeks newsletter.

With such a busy and focussed term I would like to thank you in anticipation for your support and partnership in your child's learning and indeed Stanton St Quintin Primary School.

### School News App—how the app works

Firstly, you will need to download the app from either the [iTunes App Store](#), [Google Play](#) or [Windows Store](#) by clicking on the relevant buttons below or by loading up the app store on your phone and searching for 'School News'.




Once you have located and downloaded the free app, launch the app and you will then be able to either click on the 'Find my school' button which uses the phone's GPS to locate all the schools in the surrounding 20 miles, or you can type in the school's postcode and click on 'Get my school' button. Your school's postcode is: **SN14 6DQ**

You will then see a list of schools that use the app. Click on the school you wish to view news & events for.

You will then be able to click on the 'News' button to view all of the latest news items that have been added to the school(s) you have selected and also all of the upcoming calendar events by clicking on the 'Events' button.

Clicking on 'My Schools' will display a list of schools that you view news and events for. Clicking on one of the schools will display the school address, telephone number and email address which you can click on to either phone or email the school directly from the app.

## Polite Parking Request

**Parking:** This is always a problem outside school; the use of the school bus or shared lifts will greatly help. Please note that directly opposite the school is a passing bay, not a public lay-by, please do not park in this area as this causes a grid lock at peak times when the school bus is picking up.

May we remind you that our **yellow zig zags are to be kept clear**— No picking up, dropping off, or parking! As we do not have any blue bay markings, blue badge holders may park on the zigzags if their vehicles are not obstructing access or causing danger to pedestrians—this is advice that has been taken from the PCSO community officers.
