## Did you know that registering your child for free school meals means that the school gets extra money? Even if your child receives an Infant free meal, you can still claim the £30 trip voucher! See below for details

#### You will also receive a £30 voucher towards school trips.

The Government is giving money to schools to help children to do their very best. This funding is called a 'Pupil Premium'.

For every child registered the school gets £1,300 for a primary-aged pupil (2017-2018). Examples of how this money can be spent include:

- Purchasing specialist support, audit of provision, developing the vision
- CPD for key staff
- Developing a creative curriculum
- Resources to support inclusion, software focused on specific needs
- Purchase of technology resources for individuals, existing, new and emerging
- Developing strategies for engaging children and parents in and out of school
- Developing collaboration, support or mentoring projects
- Supporting the work of schools, governors, staff and parents on e-safety
- Subsidy of school clubs, specialist teachers to promote engagement.

**The deadline to make your claim** so that the school can take advantage of this additional funding is **Monday 2nd October**, this will give time for the application to be processed and accepted by 5th October 2017 our funding day.

#### Please apply if you receive any of the following benefits even if you are entitled to the new Infant Free School Meals, as the school will receive additional funding for your child.

- Income Support
- Job Seeker's Allowance (income-based)
- Employment and Support Allowance (income-related)
- support under part six of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the Guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit providing you are NOT entitled to Working Tax Credit and your family's annual income (as assessed by HMRC) is not more than £16,190
- Working Tax Credit 'run-on' the payment you may receive for a further four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit.

### Temporary Closure of: A429 (Part), Stanton St Quintin / Hullavington / Corston / Malmesbury (Ref: TTRO 6201)

Notice is hereby given that the Wiltshire Council has made an Order to close temporarily to all traffic: Phase One:

A429 (Part), Stanton St Quintin and Hullavington; from its junction with M4 Junction 17 roundabout to a point approximately 250m north of C1 The Street.

Phase Two:

A429 (Part) Hullavington / Corston / Malmesbury; from its junction with C1 The Street to its junction with Arches Lane. To enable: Eurovia to carry out carriageway patching, reconstruction, surface dressing, road markings and associated works.

Alternative route: via A429 (unaffected length) – A433 – A4135 – A46 – A420 – A350 – A429 (unaffected length) and vice versa.

The closure and diversion route will be clearly indicated by traffic signs.

This Order which previously came into operation on 20 February 2019 will now recommence on **30 September 2019 and the closure will be required weekdays between the hours of 09:00 and 15:30 until 02 October 2019**. It is anticipated that the works will take the stated duration to complete depending upon weather conditions. Access will be maintained for residents and businesses, although delays are likely due to the nature of the works. The Order has a maximum duration of 18 months.
