



ENGLISH RECEPTION – SUMMER 2 WEEK 3 – 15.6.20

This week we will be working up to writing our own Father's Day book. These activities can be followed and made for anyone that is special to your child.

<b>Monday</b>	<p>Story – Just Like my dad. How are you like your dad? Think of personality characteristics as well as physical features.</p> <p>On a piece of paper you are going to create mind map of your dad. In the middle of the paper write 'My Dad' and put this in a bubble. Then around 'My Dad' write down (not in sentences) things about your dad that make him so special to you.</p> <p>We will use this mind map for our writing this week, so please keep it safe.</p>
<b>Tuesday</b>	<p>Re-read the story from yesterday and let your child join in with the refrain 'just like my dad'.</p> <p>Today you will begin to make your father's day book. You will need three piece of A4 paper, or card, folded in half and one inside the other, to make the book.</p> <p>On the front cover write the title 'Just Like My Dad' . Then draw and colour in a picture of you and your dad and write your own name, as you are the author, at the bottom.</p>  <p>Open the book to the first inside page spread. One the inside page write 'This is my dad' and underneath write your dad's name. On the next page draw a picture – or put a photo of your dad.</p>  <p>We will continue writing our book on Thursday.</p>

**Wednesday**

Making a Father's Day card. This card does not have to be made for dad, it could be made for anyone who is special to you.

This card is based on the wonderful story book 'Guess how much I love you'.


See the instructions below.

Support your child reading some of the instructions. Listening and following instructions are great skills to build up.

**Thursday**

Today we are continuing to make our book.


Have another look at the story and pause at page 3-4 (I've got sharp teeth, just like my dad'.



Discuss what the ... means. Explain that ... is a pause and the thought is unfinished.

Refer back to your Monday mind map – choose one of the of your physical or personality attributes to write and illustrate on these pages of your book.


Then look at pages 5 and 6 (And spiky hair ... just like my dad) and write your own version, using your mind map, for these pages in your own book.



It might be a good idea to draw lines on the page for your child's writing.

Friday

Look at pages 7-8 and 8-9.



You can choose whether to write these pages in the same way as yesterday, or you can extend the writing and follow along the same lines as the book.

You could end your book with 'I love my dad because ...'

If you are home learning, it would be wonderful to see the books that you have created.



**Step 1.** Fold the blue or black card in half to form a card template.



**Step 2.** Now make a slit in the card for the rocket to slide through. To do this, use a pencil and ruler to draw a faint line going from the top to the bottom of the card, about 2cm in from the fold. Then cut along this line, leaving around 2cm at the top and the bottom.



**Step 3.** Now make a rocket using the different coloured paper. To do this, we drew around a rectangle for the main rocket, a triangle for the top, some circles for the windows and then cut them out.



**Step 4.** Position the different shapes to make the rocket, then stick them down using glue.



**Step 5.** Cut the photograph into a circle shape, then glue in to place.



**Step 6.** Cut out the phrase 'I love you to the moon and back' and stick it onto the card. Remember to leave space for the rocket.



**Step 7.** Now decorate the main part of the card to create a background for the rocket. We have used a crescent shaped moon and some stars.



**Step 8.** Finally cut a strip of stiff card and glue on to the back of the rocket. Then thread the strip through the slit in the card. You now have a moving rocket on the card!
