Quedlinburg

Things to Do

Here are some ideas of things to do during your stay.

Broken Mountain

Take an old steam train to the summit of Broken mountain the highest peak of the Harz. Where it legend has it that witches gather on for German Halloween.



Rammelsberg Silver Mine

In operation for over 1000 years. UNESCO world heritage site. Wear miners coveralls and go down into the tunnels and ride the miniature train the miners used.

Thale

Take a gondola to the mountain top to discover the history of witchcraft

Wernigerode Castle

The small town of Wernigerode lies at the base of the Broken. Its castle sits on a hill overlooking the wonderful collection of medieval houses with elaborate wood carvings

Explore Harz National Park

The legendary mountain is part of a unique landscape which is characterized by steep mountain ranges, steep plateaus, cliffs valleys and gorges, home to a rich variety of flora and fauna.

Within the mountain forests of the higher regions feature clear mountain streams, rocks, boulder fields and bogs you can discover the 'mystical mountain magic'.



Wildlife Spotting

Lynx were re-introduced to the region in 1999.

These gorgeous tufty eared creatures are very shy, so spotting them in the wild would be very lucky. A visit to the Lynx enclosure in Rabenklippe ensures you get to see these majestic animals.

In addition to the Lynx enclosure, the Harz
National Park has a Capercallie enclosure and
two animal watching stations, allowing you to
get closer to nature
