Early Years Unit News

We are delighted to share our news....we have finally been given the approval that we have waited so long for!

From September Stanton will official lower its entry age and will accept children in the EYFS Unit from the term after their third birthday.

Reception children will be in school full time and Mrs Breen has already been in contact regarding Induction and Transition.

For our Nursery children,, we will be offering morning and afternoon sessions everyday—9.00-12.00 and 12.00-3.00pm. This provision is known as a 'school-led' provision and so will be an integral part of the school with a qualified teacher based in the setting.

Wrap around care is also available from 8.00am and 3.00-5.30pm.
