The government has said it is not asking schools to be open over the summer holidays and there is no expectation they will be open for vulnerable children and children of critical workers.

As a school we will be closing our premises at term end on Friday 17th July and will be allowing staff to take time to refresh and make the necessary changes before we open the school gates in the autumn term on Wednesday 2nd September.

Wiltshire Council is also gathering details of local providers who will have summer activities available. This will be send home as a PDF today.

The government has also confirmed for those families who normally have free school meals they will also be available throughout the summer holidays. You can find out more detail on the COVID Summer Food Fund published 25 June. We will be providing further details on how this will be managed at our school very soon.


## School holiday activity provision directory


Summer Reading Challenge 2020

## FREE - Eedi Summer School

From Craig Barton, author of **Diagnostic Questions** and 'How I wish I'd Taught Maths'

A free opportunity for year 6 students transitioning into year 7.

Starts **Monday 13<sup>th</sup> July**. **Sign up closes Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> July**.

7 weeks, 7 key topics to prepare for the KS3 curriculum.

**2 hours approx.** each week

1 **quiz** at the beginning of the week that diagnoses their misconception in the topic using diagnostic questions....

... then they book in a lesson with the **Eedi Learning Assistant** (chat bot) to resolve their misconception.

These are pre recorded sessions by Craig Barton and his team. This can be accessed by a tablet or laptop.

The content and quizzes have been developed using everything that Eedi have learnt through, **Eedi Class** and **Diagnostic Questions** in hundreds of schools over the last few years ... Many schools in Wiltshire use these diagnostic questions already.

It's **totally free**, as Eedi are trialing this as part of a new product they are developing and launching in

September... **Eedi Home** 

In September, just like Eedi Summer School, **Eedi Home** will be available as a monthly subscription for students to discover and resolve their misconceptions in math's topics, but at home. **Parents will not be expected to buy into any package but will receive an option through a mail drop. They can unsubscribe from this at any point.**
