
World Book Day at Stanton

World Book Day 2021 was set to be a logistical challenge this year due to partial school closure, however we were determined not to let this get in the way of celebrating a love of reading with the rest of the world on Thursday 4th March. And what a day it turned out to be! At Stanton we are eager readers every day of the year but World Book Day is a day to celebrate the joy of all things books and reading. Whether we were at school or home, we immersed our children in an exciting day.

This year we decided to dress up as words instead of book characters, to allow children the opportunity to continue to explore rich vocabulary we find in books. We were blown away by the range of fantastic costumes and word choices, from 'mouth-watering' to 'indecisive'!

Our Stanton World Book Day Scavenger Hunt formed the core of our day and the children were determined to explore the different activities. So many children attended our virtual ask an author event, when SSQ Patron of Reading, Sophie Cleverly, answered questions posed by our budding readers and writers. Throughout the day, children shared stories as a class and were challenged to guess who was behind the mask as part of the Masked Reader! Stanton staff shared the blurbs of their recommended reads, whilst children were suitably enthralled by the chosen masks and voices. Don't forget to order books using the shared links!

Egg box book characters were crafted, book themed cakes were baked, photos of enjoying a good book in unusual places were snapped, reading dens were built, pictures drawn at live illustrator events and books were devoured across the county. 

To mark the awesome date that is 12th March 2021 (12-3-21, which reads the same forward as backwards) and to make maths exciting and high profile in our school, we are holding a Battle of the Bands (an in-school times tables competition) in aid of Red Nose Day. It is part of a UK-wide Rock Down Relief event run by Times Tables Rock Stars and will be the biggest times tables event in the country ever!

Starting on Friday 12th March and ending on Thursday 18th March 2021, the whole competition is done online via play.ttrockstars.com or the TT Rock Stars app. For every correct answer to a multiplication or division question, your child will earn their class a point. The Times Tables Rock Stars platform will calculate the class average (the number of correct answers per pupil in the class who play during the competition hours).

All game modes (Gig, Garage, Jamming, Studio, etc.) will count but only from games played <u>between</u> <u>9.30am and 3pm</u> on Friday 12th to Thursday 18th inclusive.

To help raise money for Red Nose Day, children can use their TTRS coins to buy a virtual Red Nose Day nose for their avatar and TT Rock Stars will donate 5p!

As of September 2020, Relationship, Sex and Health Education have become a statutory part of education in England, with schools required to follow the Department for Education's statutory framework.
