Sporting Update

Cricket tournament Match Report: by Anja

Before I start my match report, I feel it is important to explain the rules of the version of cricket we played.

- Eight players may play per game.
- An over is 5 balls and there is 1 over per player.
- Batting consists of a pair facing two overs and then a new batting pair comes in.
- Scoring: runs are added in the usual way, but 2 points are added for wides and no balls with an additional bonus runs available if a ball is hit from the tee within 3 seconds of the no ball being called.
- Fielding: Players are rotated after each over, so everyone gets a turn at bowling. Batters are out if they are bowled, caught, run out, hit wicket or stumped. However, you keep batting until the end of your over and 5 runs get added to the fielding teams score instead.

Confused yet? I think the grown ups were a bit too, but it was brilliantly umpired by students from Hardenhuish.

SSQ vs Kings Lodge:

We lost the toss and Kings Lodge elected to bat first. Our bowlers did an amazing job keeping their runs to a minimum and getting a few wickets too (see notes above as to how that affects the score).

On our turn to bat, the opposition bowled quite a few wide balls allowing us to score extra runs from the tee balls, which were surprisingly tricky to hit. Archie and Jessica opened the batting followed by me and Kaidan, Brooke and Daisy and finally Henry and Elliot.

I'm pleased to say we were victorious.

SSQ vs Kington St Michael

Following on from the success of the previous match, when we won the toss as captain Archie elected to bowl first. Again, we did a good job at keeping the opponents runs to a minimum with great teamwork in the field.



When it was our turn to bat Jessica and Archie opened as before followed by me and Kaidan, Brook and Robyn and Henry and Elliot. As the previous match we managed to score additional runs from wides as we got the knack of hitting the tee balls.

Once again we were victorious!

This is an incredible achievement particularly considering the winning team Queens Crescent is a much bigger school than ours!


Darling Class Update

Amazon Class-Term 5, A Day in the Life of a Victorian Child



During Term 5, Amazon Class have taken a step back in time to explore the Victorian period. We started our learning adventures by visiting Sevington Victorian School, becoming Victorian children for the day. We experienced an authentic Victorian school day and compared this experience to what school is like now. There were quite a lot of differences! We used this experience to immerse ourselves in writing Victorian diary entries all about our first day at school and aged a portrait to complete our diaries.

This term we have also learnt about the contrast between families who were wealthy and families who didn't have very much. We have learnt about the different jobs Victorian children were expected to do, learning about the dangers of being a chimney sweep, coal miner and factory worker. We couldn't believe that some children started work as young as five!

We have enjoyed making Victorian scones, marbles and peg dolls and enjoyed lots of stories set within the Victorian period, such as 'Daisy Saves the Day' by Shirley Hughes.

To finish of our term, we have been finding out about the Platinum Jubilee to prepare for our Jubilee celebrations. We had lots of fun writing limericks about the Queen and sketched proportionate portraits of Queen Elizabeth, framed in our own homemade royal frames.
