
It was also lovely to welcome Rev. Sharon Gleed into school this term. She will be coming into

The woods has also been an important time for testing ourselves, both physically and socially, as we manage risks and learn to trust, play and work with one another.

Amazon Class-Term 1, Castles, Knights and Dragons

What a wonderful start to the year we have had! We are all starting to settle in to our new routines and year groups, starting the year celebrating all things carnival! We enjoyed exploring the book 'Bisa's Carnival', with many of us taking part in the fantastic Malmesbury Carnival Parade and winning

second prize!

As we moved in to exploring our new topic, the children have enjoyed understanding the meaning of dragons in

different parts of the world. We crafted our own fire-breathing dragons, explored different printing techniques to make our large-scale class dragon, and designed and sculpted dragon eyes. Using the book, 'The Dragon with the Blazing Bottom', the children had lots of fun writing recipes to help the dragon get his fire back.

We have also enjoying learning about castles from the Medieval Times, learning about the first Motte and Bailey castles and working together in teams to create our own castle models. We have learnt about the different castle features and their purpose and are very

proud of our fantastic double-page spread castle fact files. Using the wonderful book, 'The Castle the King Built' we have explored the

different roles inside the castle walls, making job adverts to find the perfect castle

candidates!

We explored the story of King Arthur and the Sword in the Stone, creating our own armoured knights, linking to our learning in Science when we tested different materials suitable for making protective armour.

Finally we took part in celebrating National Poetry Day, learning and performing poems by the poet, Michael Rosen. We then innovated the poem 'Oh Dear!' and

had so much fun creating funny rhymes!

In Art we studied Julian Opie, one of Britain's foremost contemporary artists, who is interested in the human body and portraits. His style is characterized by thick black outlines and solid colours. Even though the self-portraits are simplified hopefully you can recognise our faces and our characteristic expressions.



In Geography, this theme was taken further as we learnt about South America with a focus on Brazil, which was the setting for our book of the term,



The Explorer by Katherine Rundell. The children have so far used this text to inspire writing leaflets and journal entries and will complete a persuasive letter.

To celebrate National Poetry week we also learnt 'Don't' by Micheal Rosen and performed it as a class. After this we created our own Don't poems of things we are told we cannot do at school. They are quite humorous.

Our science topic of space has really captured the imagination of the children as they have learnt more about the planets in the Solar System, the revolution and rotation of Earth and other moons and planets and how this creates the seasons and day and night.
