Dinosaur Reading – Our love f dinosaurs and reading were a match made in heaven...




Amazon Class Update

If You Were an Engineer, What Would You Do?

What a fun-filled, exciting and inspiring term we have had! This term, Amazon Class have transformed into mini-engineers, learning about the many roles engineers play in our past and current world and the processes that they follow in order to design, invent, build, test and improve.

We started our topic by exploring what we thought an engineer was and what they did. The children had a whole array of interesting ideas about angineers from people who shovel spew to people who look after animal property.




Taking a step back in time, we explored some of the very first inventions, looking at photographs of the first telephone, stone wheel and bicycle. Moving back to the current time, we worked together to make wind turbines, having a go at designing, building, testing and lots of problem solving along the way! We then explored how we could try our hand at inventing to, by entering the Primary Engineering Competition. We were so excited to get started by identifying a problem and

then inventing something to solve this problem. We were blown away by the children's kind, empathetic and ingenious ideas- engineers in the making! Now that we have

completed our designs, we welcome you to explore out engineering gallery which shall be open in the school hall on Monday 20th
February between 3 and 3:30pm. If you cannot make this time with your child, our gallery shall also be displayed when you attend Parents' Evening in the first week after half term. Our competition entries shall be sent off following this and we shall await the results around May time!

Our topic was greatly enriched by our class trip to Cameron Balloons, to learn all about the different roles engineers have in creating hot air balloons. We had the best day, clambering into balloon baskets, exploring the inside of a partially inflated balloon envelope, testing a





burner and finally building our very own hot air balloons to test the theory that when heat is added to a balloon it rises. We are all greatly inspired to become engineers too! Following our trip, we used our DT skills to begin making our very own Paper Mache hot air balloons which we hope to finish after half term.

Linked to our topic this term, we have been exploring two wonderful books-The Story Machine by Tom McLaughlin and Rosie Revere Engineer by Andrea Beaty (a SSQ Reading Spine book). We have thoroughly enjoyed these wonderful books and have used our learning to write our own

innovated engineering stories.

In science we have been learning about the human body and being us! We enjoyed using our senses to explore a vast array of fruits and vegetables and arranging them into groups using our different senses. In maths we have been using our practical mathematical skills to measure height and length, using our learning to solve mathematical problems. We couldn't be prouder of Amazon Class's achievements this term and can't wait to share our learning with you at Parents' Evening.

Rhine Class Update

Rhine's topic of the term has been **Invaders and Settlers**. This included an immersive day out at Wiltshire Museum. They examined artefacts and evidence to discover what life was like in Anglo Saxon times. This included dressing up and handling some rather large and heavy weapons. One of the highlights was visiting the new Anglo Saxon gallery.





To support this work our class text has been reading Michael Morpurgo's reworking of the old English poem Beowulf. The children have studied the various techniques used in the retelling and tried to use them to write their own sequel to Beowulf in a legendary style.

In Science we have continued to learn about materials and their properties finding out which materials are good insulators and conductors, which materials are soluble and insoluble and looked at how to separate mixtures through processes like sieving and evaporation. We also explored which changes to materials could be reversible or irreversible.

In RE children have been finding out what a sacred text is and learning about the sacred texts relating to each major religion. They have created their own Powerpoint with a partner to teach the rest of the class about a sacred text. In Computing, the children have been learning how to code simple games using Scratch and have all encountered success and begun to store their finished projects in their own school scratch account, which they can also log in to, and use at home.

PE sessions this term have been sensibly based inside and we have been working on gymnastic skills and also spent some time using the apparatus which got the children very excited.



For our DT project this term we have been looking at designing and making our own juggling ball. Mr Ed Shire the chair of governors who enjoys juggling and learning circus skills in his spare time kindly supported us with this. He came in to demonstrate some juggling and the children were spellbound by his skills.

In French, we read Le Petit Chaperon Rouge and learnt Head, shoulders, knees and toes. This was great fun!
