# Sporting Update

Such an action packed term to bring to an end a superb school year. To end the week, Rhine class took part in a golf festival led by Year 6 children from local schools and indeed some of our Year 6 children had gone earlier in the day to learn how to coach the younger children and run the various golfing activities. We have recently acquired some junior golfing equipment and will be offering an afterschool club in Term 1.



Our next sporting event, was a fabulous trip to St. Mary's school in Calne for the annual lacrosse tournament. We are lucky enough to be invited to this event, as we are known to be a lacrosse playing school. The children were coached in the morning sessions by students from St. Mary's, who are expert lacrosse players, many of whom play at school's county and international level. Many of them remarked at

# Amazon Class- Term 6, Brilliant Brunel

We've had a super final term in Amazon Class to finish an incredible year. We launched into our topic with a visit to the Steam Museum where the children learnt about life on the railways and about the life and achievements of Isambard Kingdom Brunel. We took part in a workshop, dressing up as different engineers from the past and boarded and drove trains in the museum.



We used our learning throughout this term to create our Brunel fact files, whilst learning about different bridges and tunnels. We worked together to build bridges to hold a weight. Bridges and tunnels also inspired our artwork this term, using perspective drawing to sketch the Box Tunnel and watercolours to create different bridge silhouette paintings.

In English, we explored the fantastic book

'The Barnabus Project' by the Fan Brothers. This is the story of the Barnabus and his friends who are 'failed projects' that live in bell jars underground the 'Perfect Pets' shop. Barnabus and his friends were not perfect enough to make it into the pet store and so they are kept hidden from view in the underground lab until the day they finally escape and find happiness in the outside world together. The children created their own failed projects characters by mixing two animals together, drawing them in the bell jars and completing a Project File for their animal. We then wrote diary entries as our new characters and finished our English unit by sculpting our animals and homing them in their very own bell jars!





The children have been developing lots of practical maths skills this term from mass to volume, time to positions and space. Year 1 loved getting hands on with some estimating halves and quarters of volume! In music, we have loved learning to play the ukulele, building upon our musical skills and learning new notes and rhythms each week. In PE the children have enjoyed practising for Sports Day learning new skills such as skipping, sprinting and relay racing. We were so proud of the

children's achievements at Sports Day this term and hope that the children enjoy keeping active during the summer break.

We've enjoyed so many wonderful stories this term, visiting the library and reading whole class chapter books like The

Magic Finger by Roald Dahl. We also excelled in our SSQ Summer 50,000 Pages Reading Challenge, reading the most pages across the whole school! Our reading award was enjoyed by all when Mr and Mrs Whippy visited with their ice cream van to serve ice cream and books! We are so proud of all of the children for such a wonderful year filled with happiness, growth and learning. We would like to wish out Year 2 children all

## **Rhine Class Update**



Wow ,it has been a super busy term in Rhine with trips, production and lots of learning. This term we carried out a local study and we fortunate to have a visit from local historian Mr Stone who excavated Stanton Manor to find Roman remains. On one of the hottest days this term he gave us a guided tour around the village and shared so many fascinated facts about the village, included how it got its name. The fact the children found most interesting was that during WW2 fake cows were placed on the hangers on the airfield to make it seem like they were fields. We also had a follow up visit from the company who are planning to build a solar farm in the locality.

In English the children have been completing their mystery stories and did a very impressive job building in red herrings and cliffhangers into their writing. The other big project this term has seen them working on a joint English and Science report into 'Light.' In pairs, they have created PowerPoint presentations to introduce light and explain that it travels in straight lines. They have explained how light bounces into our eyes to enable us to see, used scientific terminology such as transparent, translucent and opaque and described how shadows are formed. Not only has this allowed them to deepen their understanding of this topic, it has allowed them to practise their typing, proof reading and editing skills and consolidate their understanding of how to effectively use PowerPoint. They have really enjoyed then delivering their presentations, which include pictures and links, to their classmates.


In RE, the children have been learning about the views of creation from the book of Genesis, and as a contrast also the other major global religions' views on creation. They have also learned about the Big Bang and Theory of Evolution, which has led to some impressive and well-informed discussions amongst the class. We also visited Malmesbury Abbey to take part in a Lifepath event where we had the chance to reflect on our choices and think about

In art the children studied Cityscapes and looked at work from a selection of artists including Yvonne Jacquette an American painter and printmaker who is famous for her aerial cityscapes and her night views of New York City. The children then had great fun designing their own cityscapes.

In Computing, children have been learning about gathering data and storing it into spreadsheets. We have used Excel to store data that the children have gathered, and then display it into different forms with pie graphs and bar charts as well as learning to sort data alphabetically or numerically. The Digital Leaders gave a presentation on staying safe while using Roblox, which (if you aren't familiar) is a popular online gaming platform where people can create and play games.



Rhine Class love solving problems, so we celebrated our last maths lesson of the year with a doughnut problem. Then enjoyed real doughnuts on the field – a great end to the term!
