
We hope you enjoyed a lovely half term break and that the children are excited to be returning to school. It is set to be an exciting term with lots of new opportunities and experiences.

<p>English</p> 	<p>Y3&4: Will use two books next term. Firstly 'The Fossil Hunter' a book by Kate Winter which connects nicely with the work we have been doing in Science on Mary Anning; we will be using this text primarily for reading lessons.</p> <p>The Ever Changing Earth by Grahame Baker Smith will be the text we use for most of our writing lessons this term.</p> <p>Topics from both books and also current affairs will be used for our weekly oracy discussions and development.</p>		<p>Y5&6: We will be reading a haunting wordless story 'Unspoken' by Harry Cole, about a young girl's courage when she discovers a runaway slave hiding in the barn. The children will create wanted posters, write letters of advise (a chance to apply their learning on subjective!) retell in role and then write a biography on Harriet Tubman.</p> <p>We will also be reading a selection of books including The Hobbit and books by Ross Montgomery prior to him visiting us after Easter.</p> <p>In class discussions we will be drawing upon knowledge of the world to support own points of view and explore different perspectives.</p> <p>We will also be focusing on formal and informal language, as well as starting sentences with a subordinate clause.</p>

Forest School Learning - YEAR 5 & 6 ONLY

This half term, Years 5 & 6 will have Forest School with Mrs Breen on a Wednesday afternoon, from 1.30pm-3.00pm. Our activities this term will complement the class topic 'North America'. There will be a focus on collaborative projects to encourage good communication, cooperation and friendship. These activities will include building tipis, weaving, totem poles, telling stories with traditional North American story stones. We will hope to have a campfire too.

Forest School will take place whatever the weather, with the exception of high winds or thunderstorms. On Forest School days children should come dressed in layers of clothes suitable for being outdoors (clothes that you don't mind getting dirty) and appropriate for the weather. These must include long sleeves and trousers (no skirts, shorts or dresses), to protect from scratches and bites, including ticks. Children will need to wear waterproof trousers and wellies (wellies should come in a named bag). Extra socks, hat and gloves are recommended in cold weather. Unfortunately, any child who is not suitably dressed will not be able to join us for Forest School, for their own safety.

We rely on parent helpers to make Forest School possible, without parent helpers Forest School cannot take place. Weather ready/PE

Children should have a named coat in school at all times as we will go outside in most weathers. **PE will be on a Friday** and children can come into school in their PE kit on this day.

Snacks and Water bottle

It is very important that children are keep fuelled and hydrated throughout the day so your child will need a named water bottle in school every day.

We also recommend that have **a healthy snack at break time** to keep them going till lunchtime. Please ensure any reusable snack pots are named. No crisps, chocolate or other sugary snacks should be brought into school for morning break.
